

## 000240. Embroidery Hoop Wall Pocket



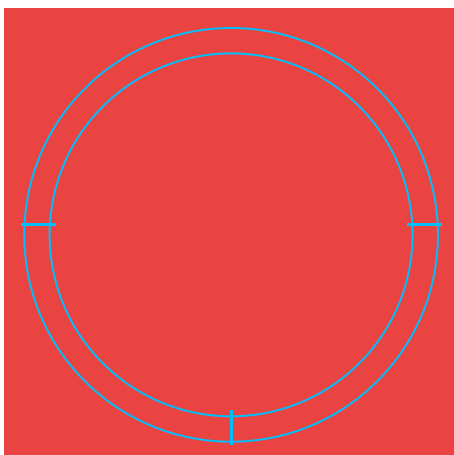
### Material

- Pen holder (CAPENHL1)
- Erasable pen (CAPEN2)
- High-tack adhesive fabric support sheet (CASTBL2)
- Iron-on fabric appliqué contact sheet (CASTBL1)
- Fabric – 7 kinds
- Self-adhesive stabilizer material (non-woven or fabric) – Approx. 30 cm × 30 cm (11.8" x 11.8")
- Embroidery hoop (wood, 24 cm (9.4") diameter) – 1
- Rick rack (red) – Approx. 80 cm (31.5")
- Hand-embroidery floss (#25, beige)
- Sewing machine thread
- Craft adhesive
- Embroidery needle
- Sewing machine
- Iron
- Sewing Scissors

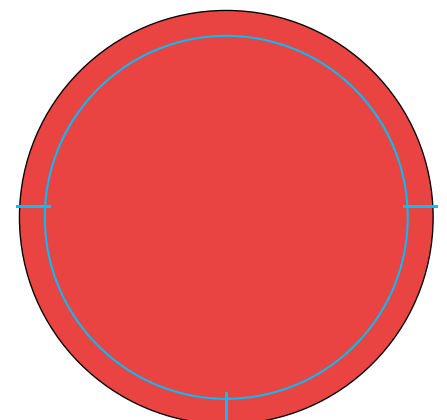
(1) Attach the high-tack adhesive fabric support sheet to the standard mat (For details on attaching the sheet, refer to the instructions included with it.). Then, insert the erasable pen into the pen holder.

(2) Attach the base fabric to the mat prepared in step (1), draw pattern A, and then peel it off the mat. Attach the self-adhesive stabilizer material to the back of the fabric, and then cut along the outer circle with fabric scissors.

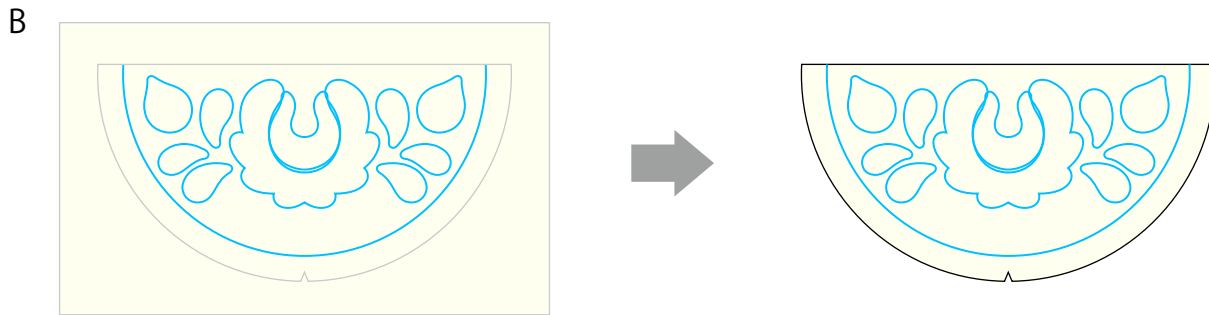


A (back)

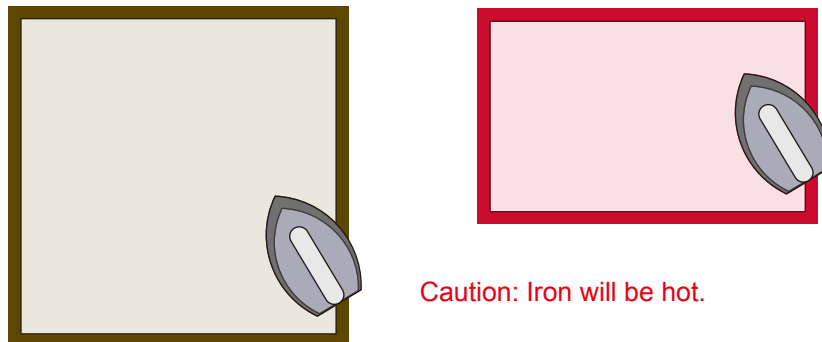


Caution: Iron will be hot.

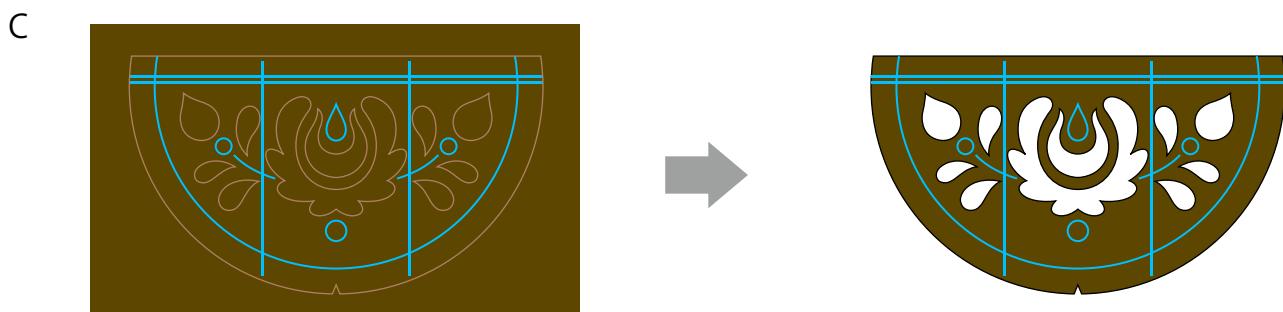
(3) After attaching the fabric for the back of the pocket to the mat prepared in step (1) and drawing pattern B, install the standard cut blade holder and cut out the pattern.



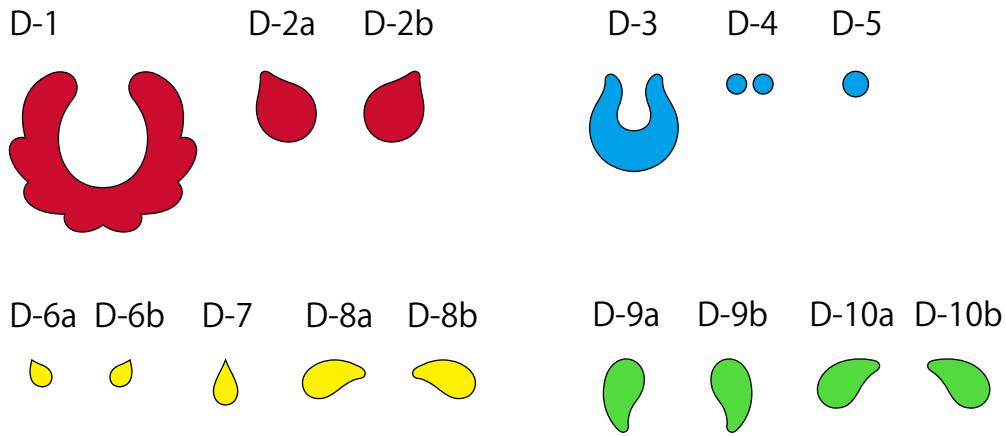
(4) Attach the iron-on fabric appliqué contact sheet to the back of the fabrics for the designs and the front of the pocket. (For details on attaching the sheet, refer to the instructions included with it.)



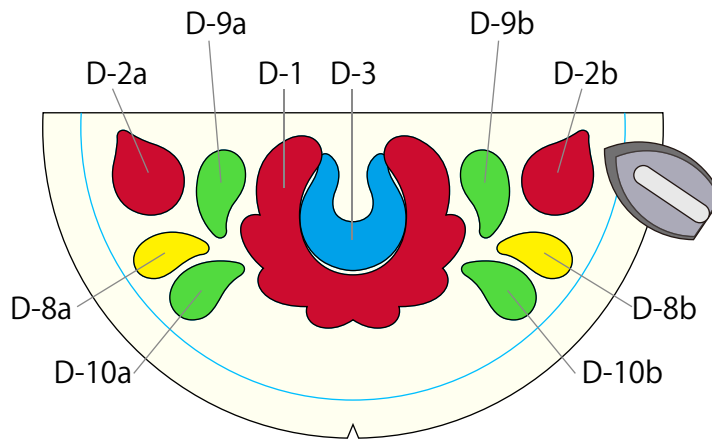
(5) After drawing pattern C on the fabric for the front of the pocket, install the standard cut blade holder and cut out the pattern.



(6) Cut D from the fabrics for the designs.

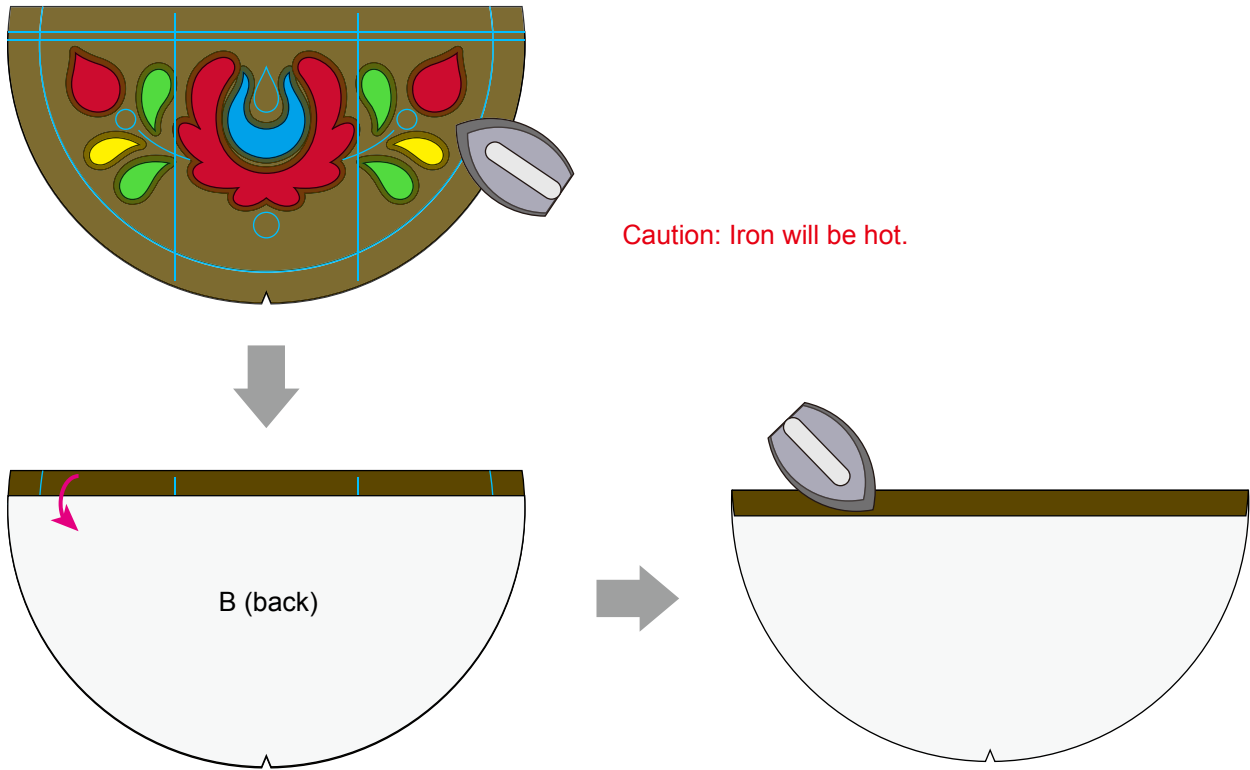


(7) Iron on the pieces assembled in step (6) over the drawing lines on the piece assembled in step (3), as shown below.

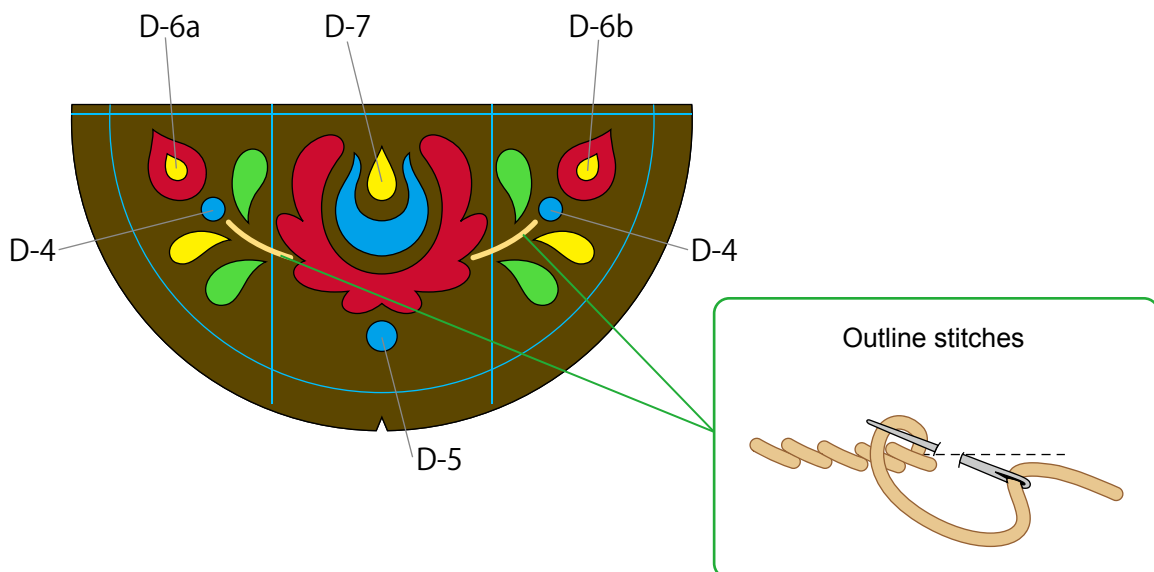


Caution: Iron will be hot.

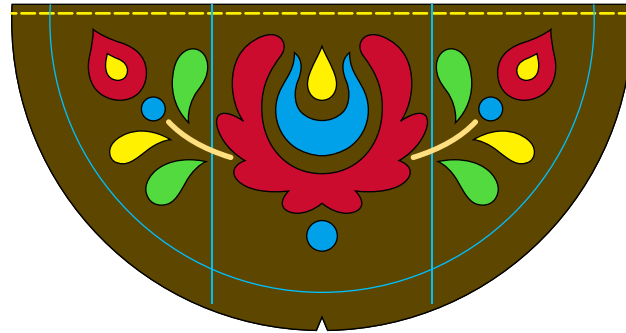
(8) Stack the piece assembled in step (5) over the piece assembled in step (7), and then iron them together, as shown below. Fold the top edge over to the back, and then iron together.



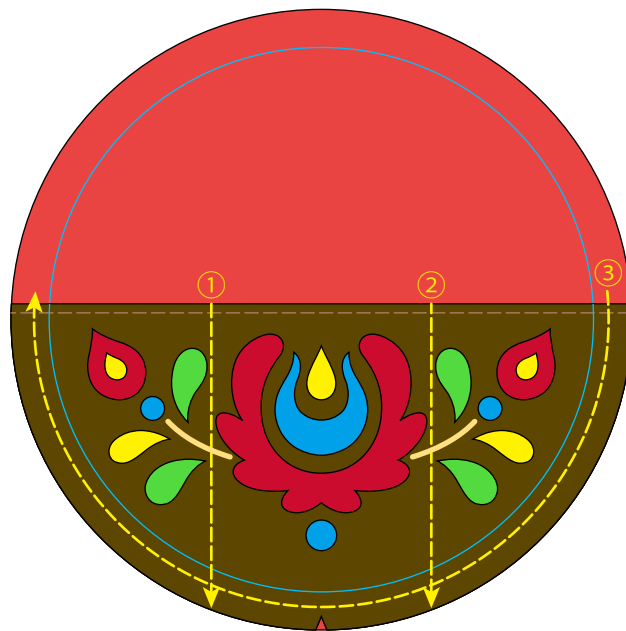
(9) Glue on the remaining parts as shown below. Sew outline stitches with only three strands of the #25 embroidery floss.



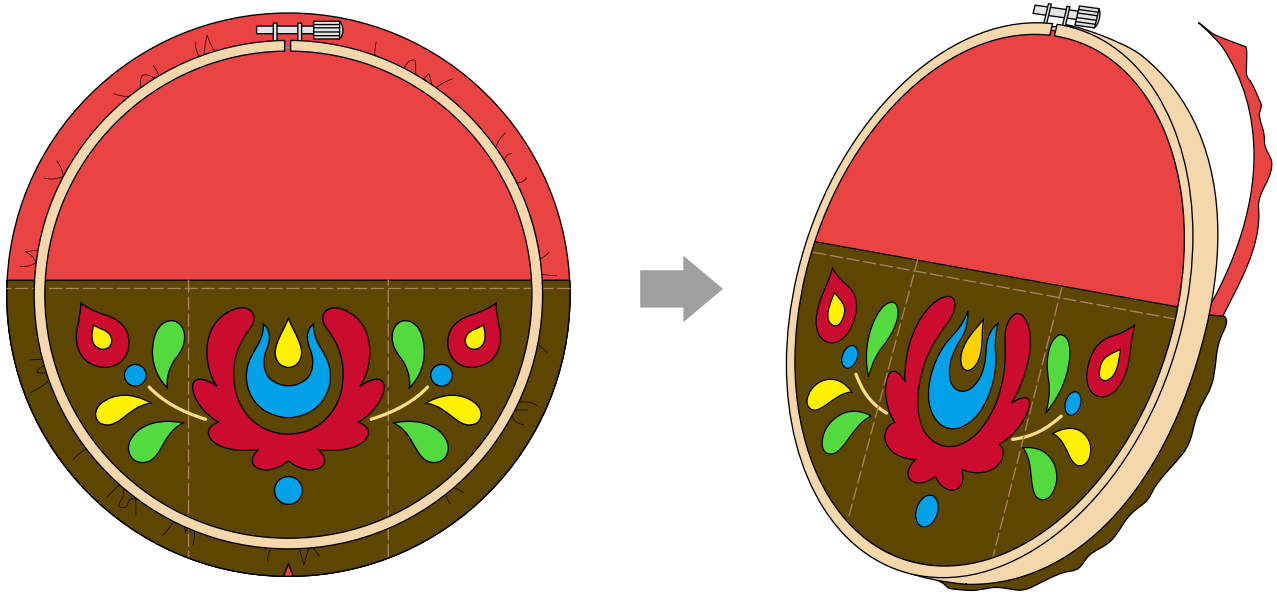
(10) With a sewing machine, sew along the line at the top.



(11) Stack the piece assembled in step (10) on top of the base fabric assembled in step (2), and then sew with the sewing machine, as shown below.



(12) Hoop the piece assembled in step (11) in the embroidery hoop as shown below, and then firmly tighten the screw. With scissors, cut off any excess fabric, and then apply craft adhesive to the cut edges.



(13) With craft adhesive, glue rick rack around the outside of the embroidery hoop.
