

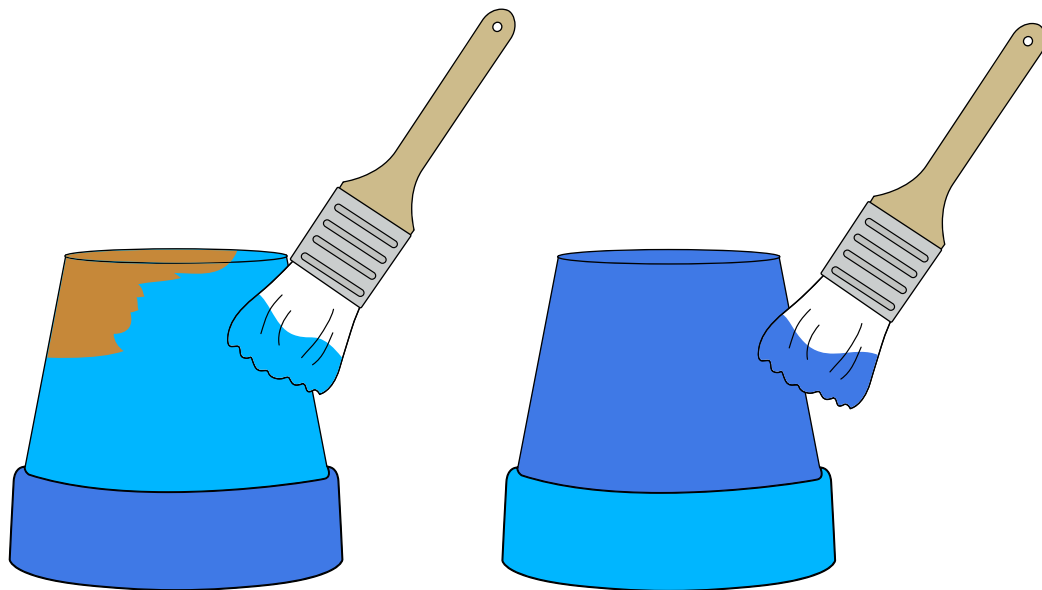
## 000246. Stenciled Flowerpot Wind Chimes



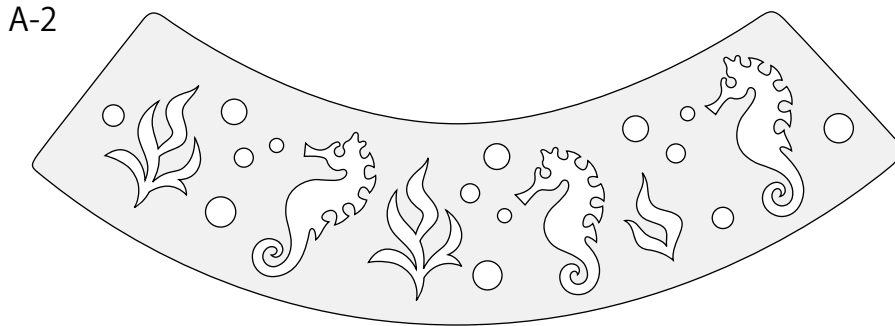
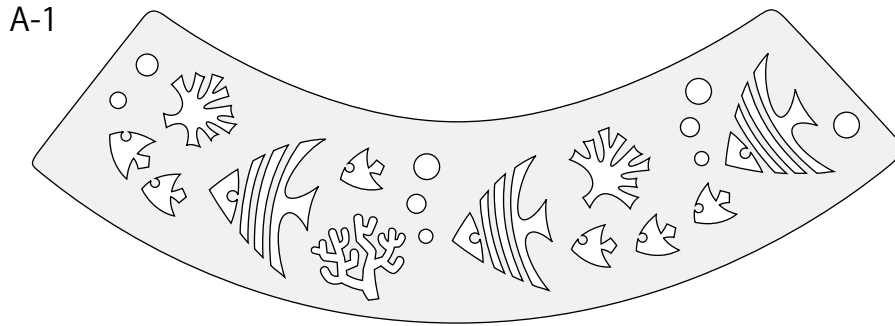
### Material

Stencil Sheet (CASTCL1)  
Unglazed flowerpot (9.5 cm (3.74") diameter) – 2  
Thin plastic sheet (blue shade) – 2 colors  
Acrylic paint – 7 colors  
String (approx. 3 mm (0.1") thick, approx. 60 cm (23.6") long) – 2  
Bead ends (21 mm (0.8"), white) – 4  
Wooden sticks (disposable chopsticks, etc., 5 cm (2") long) – 2  
Stencil sponge brush  
Flat brush or paintbrush  
Masking tape

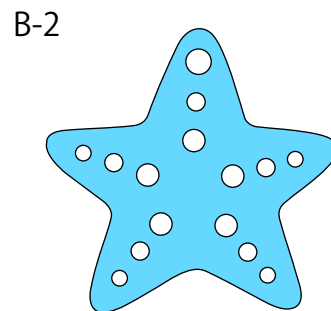
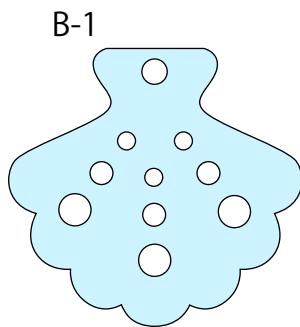
(1) Paint the flowerpots the base colors as shown below.



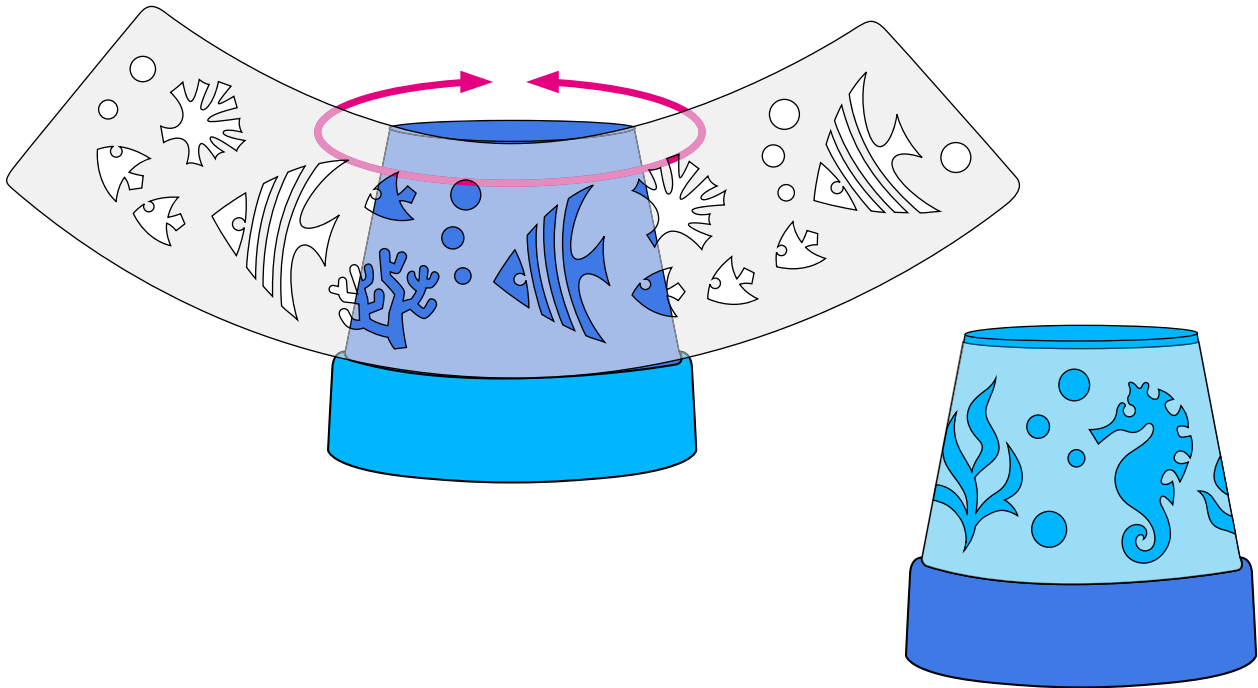
(2) With the backing paper of the stencil sheet facing down, attach it to the mat, and then cut out A.  
(For details on specifying settings, refer to the instructions included with the sheet.)



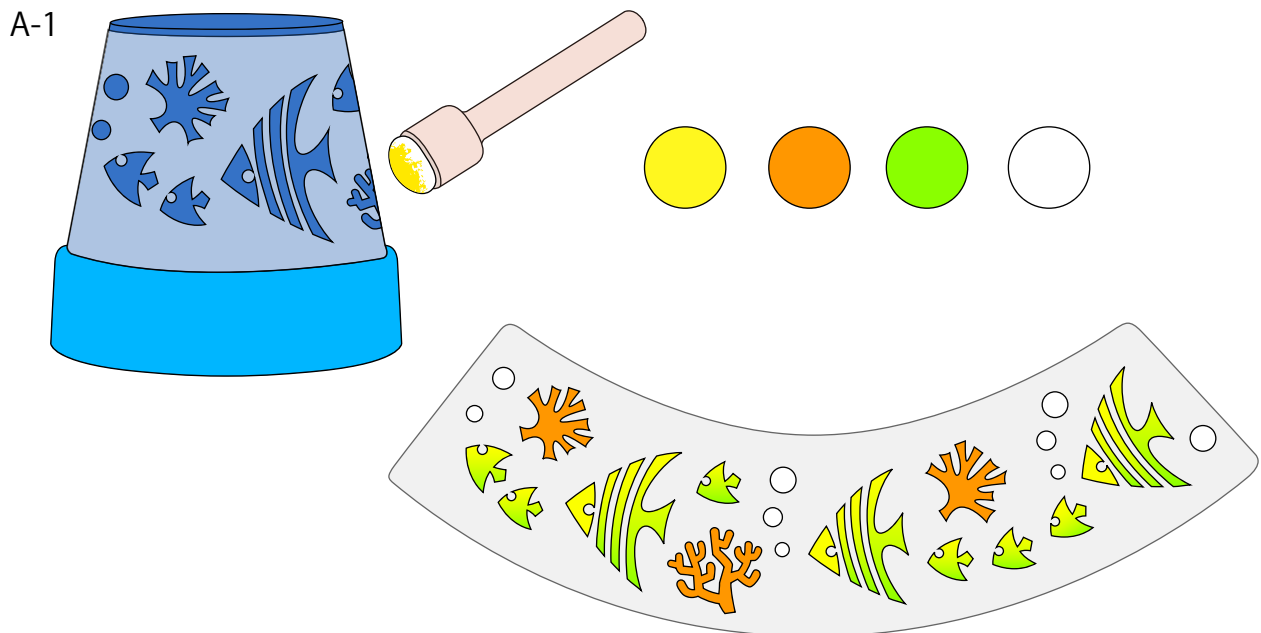
(3) Cut B from the thin plastic sheet.



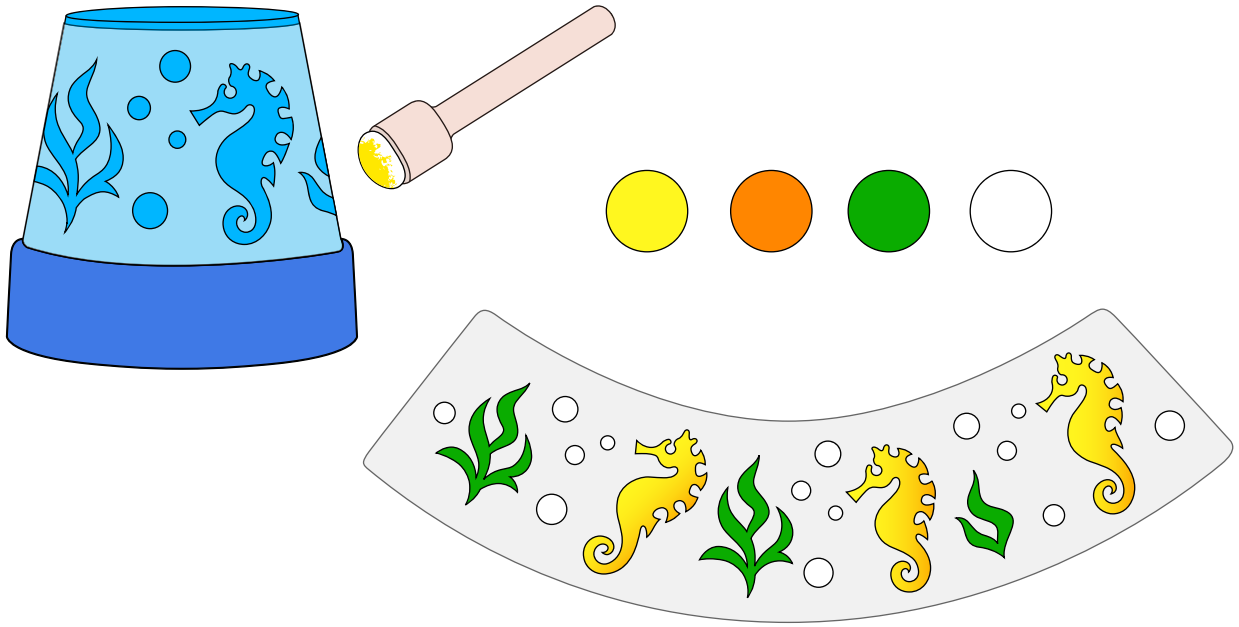
(4) After checking that the paint on the flowerpots has completely dried, attach A-1 and A-2. If the adhesion is insufficient, improve it with masking tape.



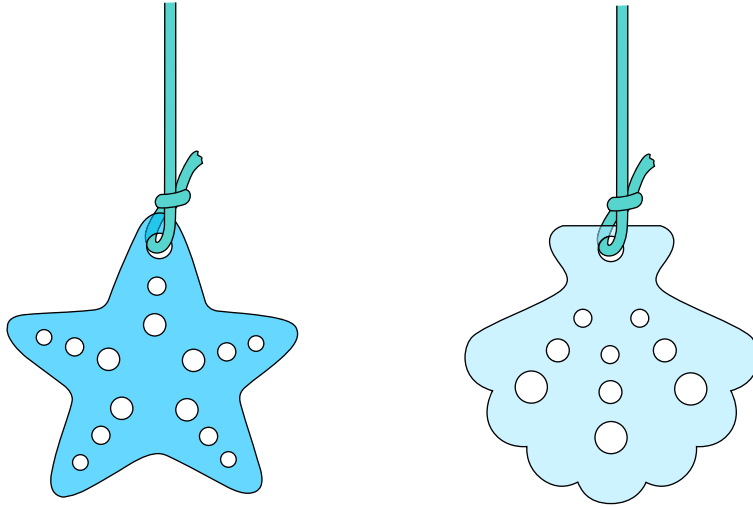
(5) Apply acrylic paint to a sponge brush, and then stencil as shown below.



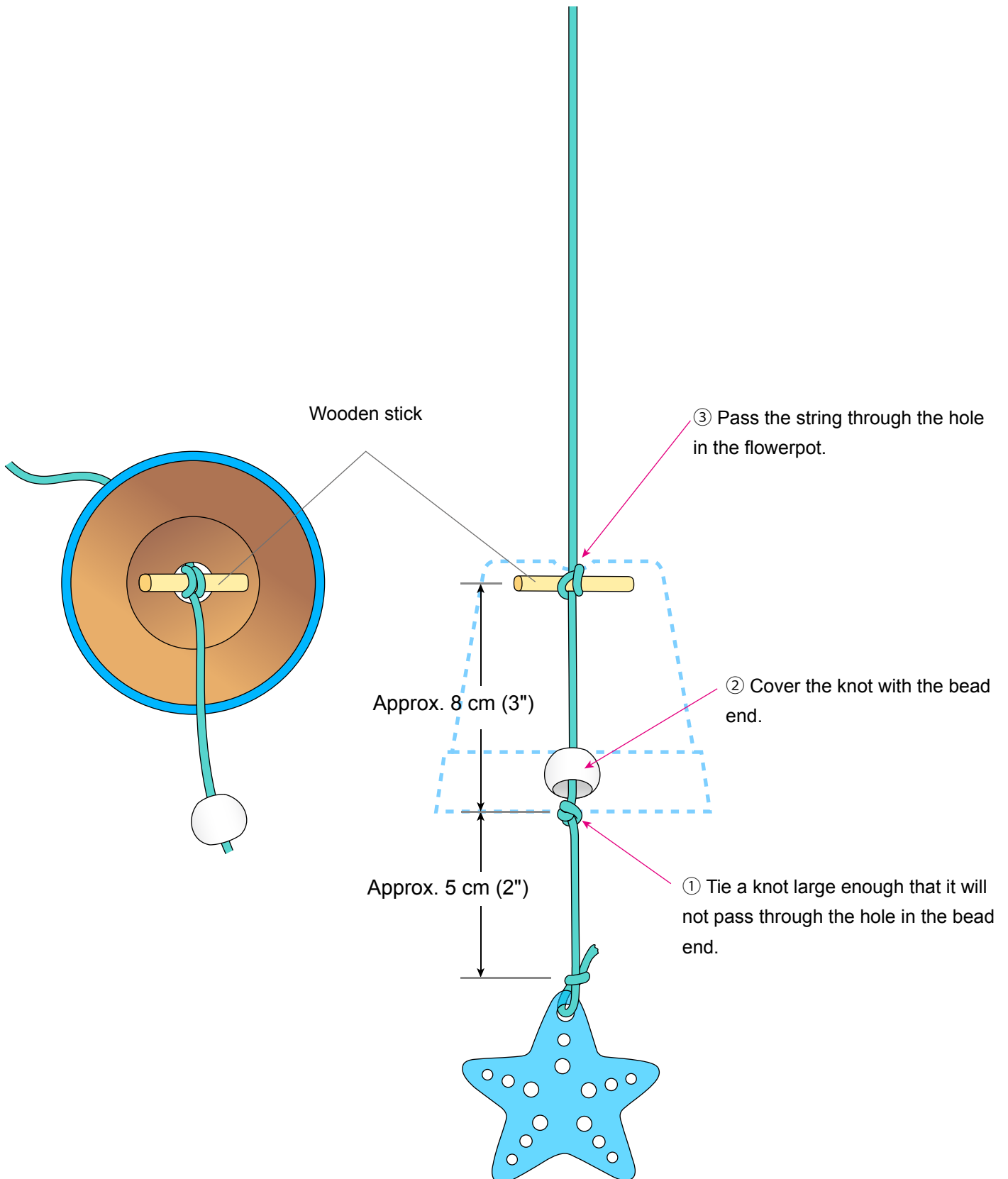

(6) Tie B-1 and B-2 to the end of each string.



(7) As shown below, tie a knot in each of the strings from step (6), cover each knot with a bead end, tie a wooden stick above each knot, and then pass each string through the hole in a flowerpot.



(8) Finish with a bead end on top, and then hang the wind chime.
