

000356. Cork Notebook Cover

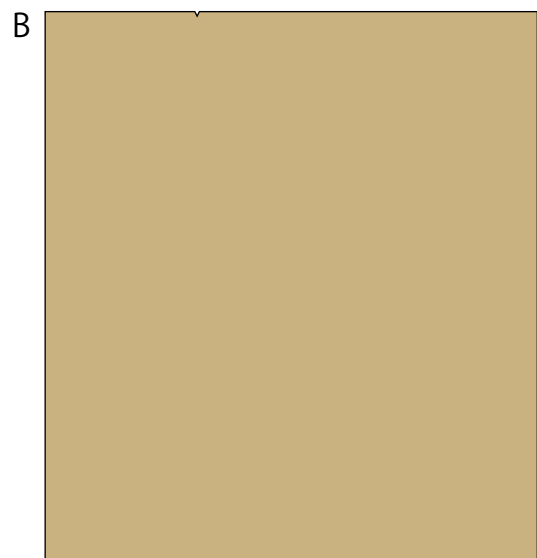
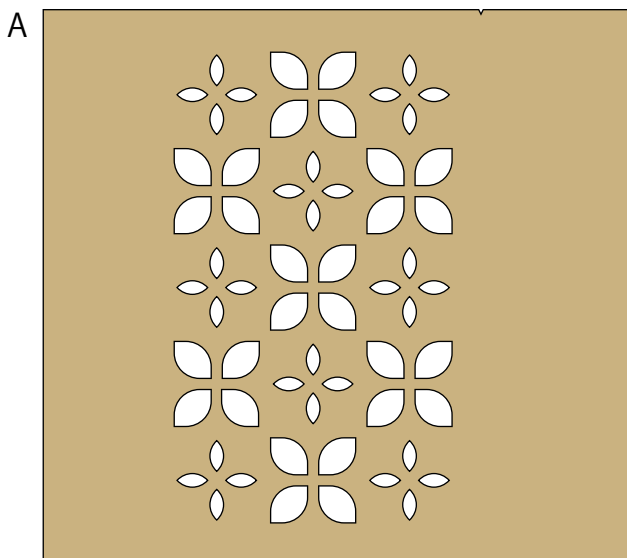


Material

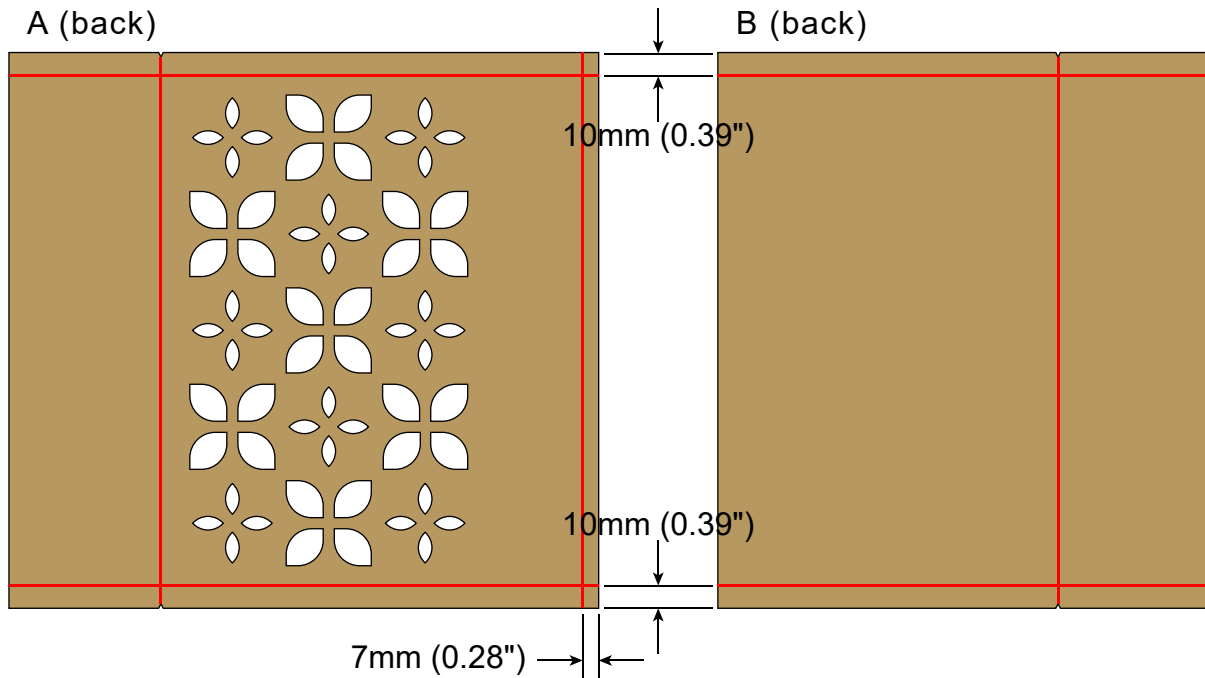
- High tack adhesive fabric support sheet (CASTBL2)
- Cork sheets (0.4 mm (0.016") thick) – 1 kind
- Patterned fabric (at least 350 mm (13.78") × 240 mm (9.45")) – 1 kind
- Laminating film for fabric (matte)
- Sewing machine thread
- Sewing machine
- Iron
- Ruler
- Erasable pen
- Sewing scissors, or rotary cutter and cutting mat
- Craft adhesive glue
- A5-size notebook

(1) Attach the high tack adhesive fabric support sheet to the standard tack adhesive mat. (For details on attaching the sheet, refer to the instructions included with it.)

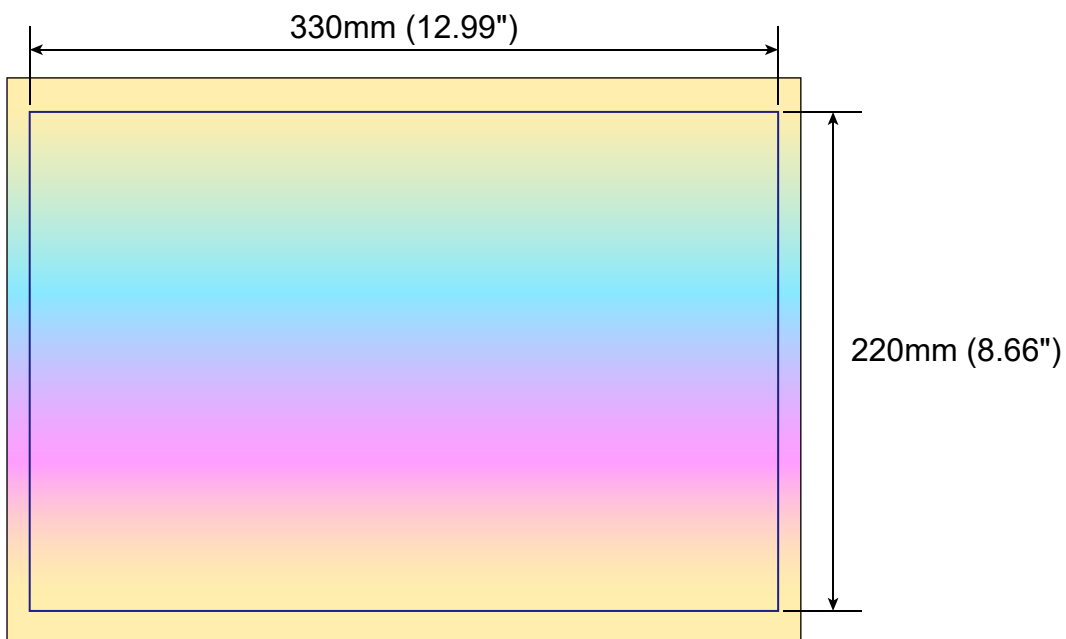
(2) Attach the cork sheet to the mat, and then cut out A and B.



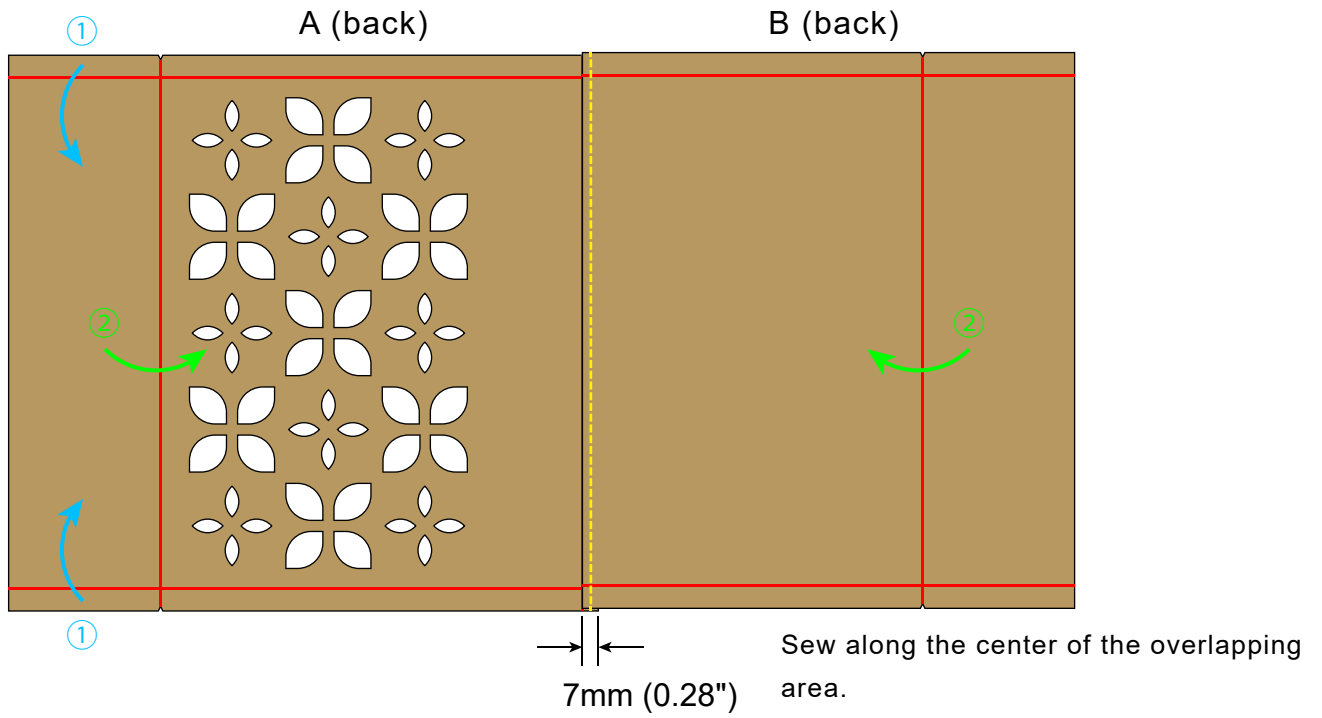
(3) Mark the backs of A and B as shown below.



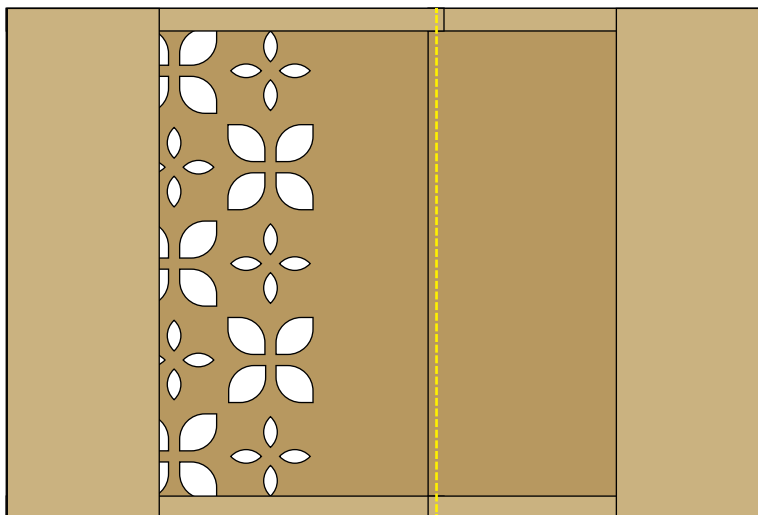
(4) Stack the laminating film on the front of the patterned fabric, and then iron them together. (For details on attaching the film, refer to the instructions included with it.) After it has cooled completely, peel off the backing paper, and then cut them with the sewing scissors or rotary cutter, as shown below.



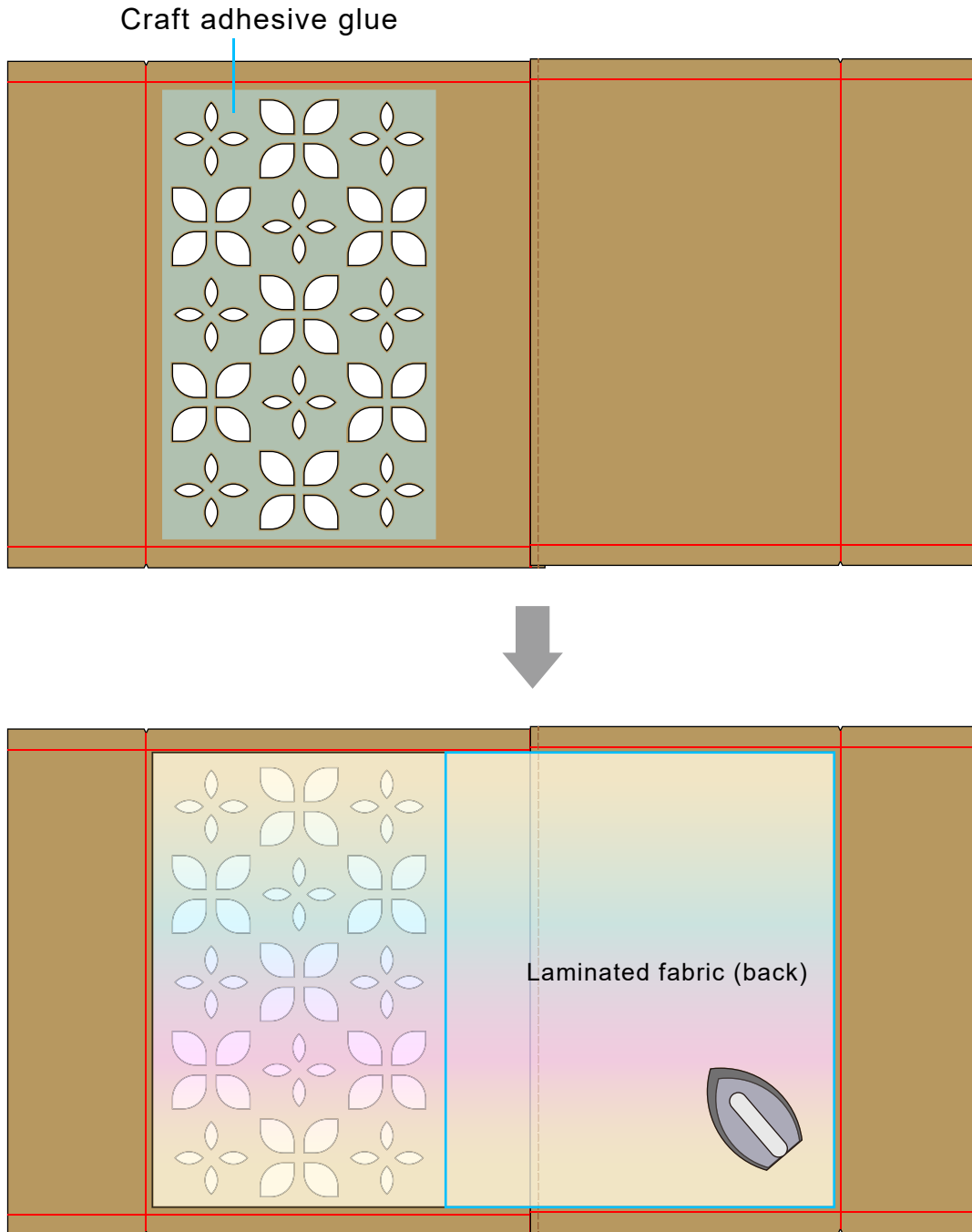
(5) Overlap and sew together A and B as shown below, and then iron the folds.



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When ironing the cork sheet, use a low temperature and frequently check the condition of the material.

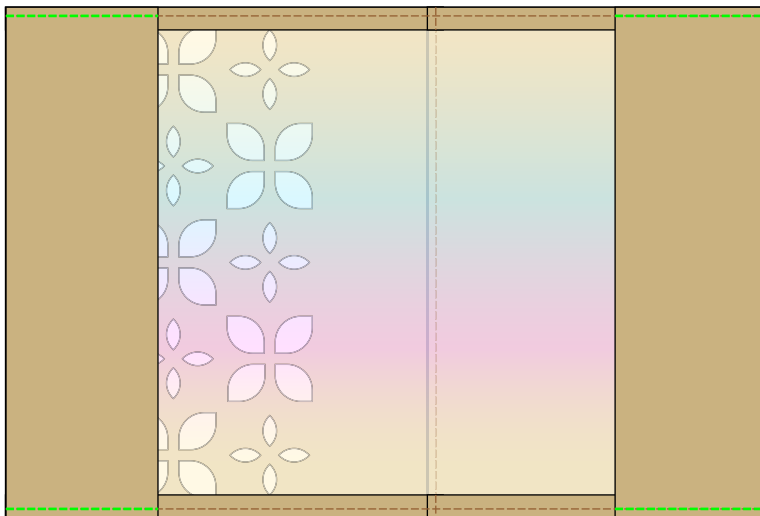
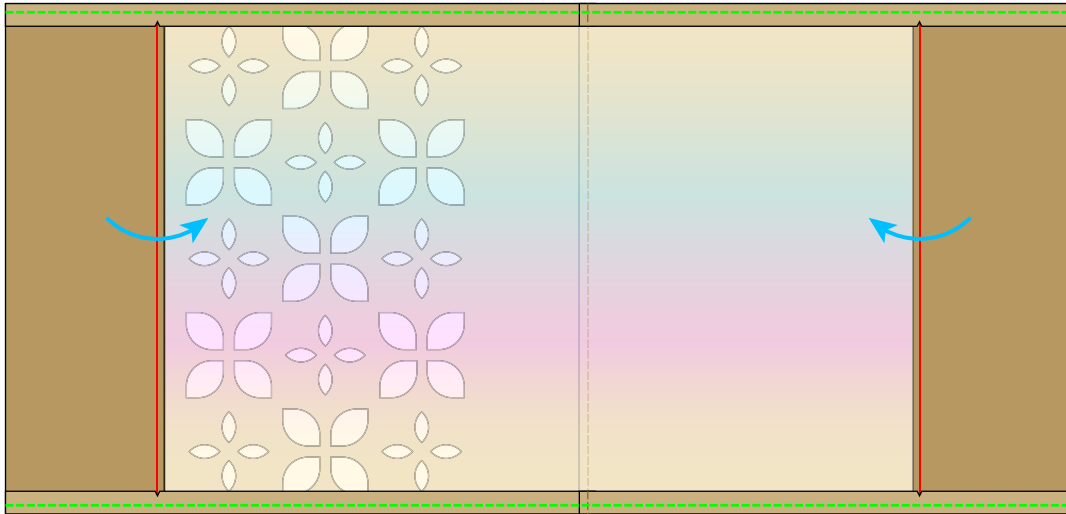


(6) Open the folds from step (5), and then lightly apply glue, as shown below. Stack the laminated fabric from step (4) on top and glue together.



The right side can be lightly pressed with an iron.

(7) Fold over and sew the seam allowances at the top and bottom, and then fold over and sew the left and right sides, as shown below.



Sew over the stitching.
